### **Bristol Fairtrade – leading in Europe**

Bristol Fairtrade Co-ordinator, Jenny Foster, was invited to be the keynote speaker at the first national Fairtrade conference in the Czech Republic in October. This demonstrates how Bristol is seen as a leading Fairtrade city in the world and we are in demand to share good practice ideas.

The two key aspects of the presentation were:

- How Fairtrade should be a part of local government work on sustainability
- How to engage local businesses with Fairtrade and increase Fairtrade procurement.

Jenny, with Elaine Ashley (Fairtrade Ambassador) were part of the UK delegation at the International Fairtrade Towns Conference in Poznan, Poland in November.

160 delegates from 23 countries gathered to hear about the first Fairtrade towns in Poland, Japan and Brazil, and saw the launch of

the Fair Trade Beyond 2015 Declaration. This is a call for just and ethical trade rules and practices to be incorporated in the future development framework that will take on the United Nations Millennium Development Goals when they expire in 2015, as an effective tool against poverty and reliance on aid.
