# **PROJECTS STATUS**

### **Biodiversity**

Lorraine is still keen to run this event, but in conjunction with Friends of Badock's Wood.

There is a lot of interest ecologically and historically in the wildlife area along the river, including an old mill with many sluices and tower for generating a head of water (potential for renewable energy) – could be suitable for a Heritage Lottery Fund grant. This is a privately-owned wildlife park which has become run down. There is a lot of potential, but difficult to progress anything of such scope without a concerted plan and people coming together. Could the Neighbourhood Partnership take this up? Next meeting 4th March.

#### Energy

Would it be worth investigating village level schemes for renewable energy generation?

Need to find ways of engaging people. Green Doors is successful at attracting visitors, though it is unknown how many people do anything about what they have seen. Could have tour around eco-house in Coombe Dingle. Provide practical examples for people to engage with rather than theory.

### Get Growing

Get Growing Trail, 8-9 June.

Other local events as well as market are good occasions for selling plants and raising SusWoT profile at the same time.

Hattie, Alex and Mike are diversifying their vegetables into french beans, runner beans, courgettes, pumpkins, red peppers, chillies and more. Break wholesale packs of 1,000 seeds down into smaller packs for sale at market for 50p each. Sow some of them – there is a schedule! Also, 1,500 tomatoes. Commercial seeds are getting increasingly poor value, more expensive for fewer seeds, so SusWoT plants are an even better buy.

# **Planning**

Tesco's and their TRO.

Opinions regarding the new Tesco's were varied. Whilst may object in principle to their very existence, there is an argument that anything that draws trade into the village and away from remote shopping centres is a good thing and there will be a cascade of benefit to other businesses.

Setting aside wider opinions on Tesco plc, the location of the new shop is extremely awkward for loading and extending the loading area can only exacerbate traffic problems at the busy roundabout with narrow approaches, zebra crossings/ traffic islands etc.

#### **Transport**

Sustainable transport grants from council - <a href="http://www.bristol.gov.uk/page/local-sustainable-transport-grants">http://www.bristol.gov.uk/page/local-sustainable-transport-grants</a>. Grants from £500 to £100,000 to encourage sustainable transport and active lifestyles. They are looking for bottom up, community led, projects, whereby project ideas come from local communities. Closing date, 29 March.

Pedestrianisation – Alistair Watson. Encourage walking, cycling etc. Could also provide a location for the market, strengthening the local community. Difficult for small groups of individuals to gather momentum and access complex systems, need local councillors to champion causes and co-ordinate input from constituents and multiple local organisations.

Lighting for quiet lanes to encourage people walking at night.
