Secondary Glazing in a listed building

The work was carried out by a company called Mitchell and Dickinson and we are delighted by their work.

After an initial survey and measuring visit, they start by refurbishing the existing windows, the woodwork, putty, sash cords and so on.





They then applied the secondary glazing sheets. These are customized to fit each window. Insulating brushes are fitted where necessary to draught proof them.

Finally new ironmongery is also fitted along with brass locks.



This installation can take several days but the results are stunning and discreet.

The secondary glazing sheets are held on by magnets and can easily be removed with one finger for cleaning, though this is rarely needed as it's effectively a sealed unit. A sucker pad is also supplied for easy removal.



The resulting lack of draughts and added insulation is saving us a lot of money and makes our home so much more comfortable.
