# **REGULAR ITEMS**

## **Domestic Energy**

November Energy Fair - Saturday 8th November 2026

Retrofit West Feedback Session

Liz attended this event. There were other community groups, from Widcombe, Emerson's Green, Marshfield as well as Andy O'Brien. We have been told there are 13 community groups altogether, but we are not allowed to know about them! There were organisations such as CHEESE, BEN and other professional groups. It did not seem very fruitful in terms of giving feedback.

## **Sustainable Holidays**

We have put an article in Henleaze Voice.

We could form a small group to look into this more and ideally an area of the website in the Using Less theme where people can share their experiences. **Fran** will look into creating this.

## **Litter**

The Civic Society scheme to develop litter picking in new areas is going ahead, starting in Southmead. SusWoT will do a preliminary clean removing historic litter as starting from scratch can be overwhelming for new people. New litter tends to be out in the open and easy to remove. This will start in Southmead. We need to progress leaflets about this for Southmead - **check with Lily**. We also need some content from the Civic Society to include in the leaflet. We decided it would be better to start in July/August when the weather is good and going out picking is a more attractive proposition, even if people may be on holiday for some of that time. There are existing groups in parts of Southmead including Doncaster Road park and Pen Park Rd that are often monthly.

Liz has also tested a child's picker that does not look as robust, but does appear to be repairable. The hoop is also smaller, but the handle is the same as the adult version.

There is a question of whether there is enough work to keep both Friday and Sunday activities weekly. Discuss with Sunday regulars how to progress this session.

### **Trout in the Trym - River Cleaning, Himalayan Balsam**

Two people completed clearing balsam in just over an hour last week as there is now less growing due to the success of previous years' efforts. Use Friday sessions to focus on river activities.

### **Get Growing**

Alex sold 15 tomatoes today to neighbours and other contacts. We donated 24 to St Ursula's school.

### **Library Garden and Community Garden**

Library garden is going well. They are organising a watering and weeding group. This could be an early candidate for our new WhatsApp community.

Jim and Lesley have not yet managed to replace the rotten arch. There is a question about the whereabouts of a plaque that had been on the arch.

We can open for 2 hours at the community gardens on the day of the September Get Growing trail - have an open working party day. 20th September, 10-12pm. Put in Henleaze Voice September edition.

We used paid publicity for open garden day which did not seem to get a lot of response.

Liz went to a community climate action group at the cricket ground.

Liz is in touch with Matthew. The software needs updating. We may be able to take over the software ourselves.

If it doesn't work soon, **Liz will replace the app on the website** with a notice for people to contact us by email.

### **Future Direction of SusWoT**

Could we revive the harvest meal in a different form - bring and share type event rather than the professionally cooked meal we had before? We could book the Village Hall for a Sunday when it is usually closed - **Liz can ask.**
